Steps to successful implementation



Select your skill plan

Head to the Skill plans page under the Learning tab to see all skill plans. IXL provides skill plans based on textbooks, state standards, assessments, and more.

Determine the skill plan(s) you want your teachers to focus on, and encourage them to pin the plan for their students. Teachers can pin multiple skill plans or change them throughout the year.





Tip: Lead admins can spotlight a skill plan for everyone in their organization to encourage school- or district-wide alignment. Click on the lightbulb icon next to a skill plan to spotlight it.



Use research best practices to maximize growth

Have teachers monitor progress

To maximize IXL's impact, we recommend students work on skills until they reach proficiency (a SmartScore of 80). Research shows students perform better on state assessments when they reach proficiency (a SmartScore of 80) in two skills per week.

Tip: Set a goal of 2 skills proficient per week per subject.

Incorporate skill plans into instructional routines

IXL is flexible and can support your teachers' daily instruction in different ways. Teachers can assign IXL skills as a warm-up, exit ticket, homework, or review.

Share this implementation plan with your teachers to ensure they know how to use skill plans effectively. It walks them through how to use skill plans as part of in-class instruction and how to assign skills from the plans for independent practice.








Admin-level data
