


IXL Analytics gives teachers a simple way to hold students accountable and even guide virtual instruction for at-home learning.

Keep track of students' assignments on IXL

The Score Grid shows you at-a-glance where your class is with their weekly IXL assignments. At the end of the week, click "last 7 days" to do a quick scroll through each learner's progress and check off students who have met their SmartScore goals on assigned skills.

For a closer look at individual skills that you assigned, visit the Skill Score Chart. You'll get a full picture of your class's performance on a single skill, including their SmartScores, time spent, and when they last worked on the skill.



Prioritize topics for whole-class instruction

If you are delivering lessons virtually, tap into your Trouble Spots report for instant insights on where your students need support. You'll see a checklist of skills that your students are struggling with, along with questions that you can use for modeling and reteaching in your virtual whole-class sessions.






Identify students who may benefit from 1-1 conferencing

Your Students Quickview is an invaluable tool for planning 1-1 virtual conferences. When you see students whose progress is slowing or whose usage of IXL could use a boost, prioritize them when you are scheduling your 1-1 meetings.



Guide your 1-1 discussions with students

When it's virtual conference time, use the Student Details report to start the discussion with each student. You can look at recent IXL practice together, ask questions about what the student is learning, and celebrate successes! If you see a skill that your student has been struggling with, drill into the Questions Log to review their missed questions and help get them back on track.
